




rubber bands (x4)








heavy books (2-3)

#### STEP 18 Collect your plant, if you don't know what type of plant you have, do some research and try and find out!




## Once you've figured out your plant, it's time to make your plant press! Make sure your plant is dry, then start by laying out your materials in the following order:





A plant press is actually a type of equipment that botanists will use to flatten out and dry any field samples so they can be stored!

STEP 3. Now we're going to flatten our plant press (making sure that our plant is tucked all the way in) and secure it with rubber bands.




arrange your rubber bands like a tic-tac-toe board (two vertical and two horizontal)

Almost done! Place your plant press in a dry place underneath some heavy books. This will also help your plant to dry faster.



# You did it! For the best results with your pressed plant, change the newsprint paper out every four days for two weeks.



don't forget to put everything back together!
